HERBISON ROAD SEWER REHABILITATION WORK

On June 12, 2008, a large construction project began. This project is a major sewer rehabilitation along Herbison Road from Rambler Road to just east of Addington Drive (Creek Side Subdivision). The contractor, E.T. MacKenzie, will be digging a trench in the westbound lane of Herbison Road to replace approximately 2,000 feet of 18-inch sewer main. Additionally, 1,101 feet of sewer main will be repaired using an interior lining process. This work, along with the restoration of the road, is expected to be completed by August 22, 2008, weather permitting.

While the work is being completed, Herbison Road is **closed to through traffic** from BR-127 west to DeWitt Road. A detour has been established which routes traffic to Clark Road via DeWitt Road and BR-127. Access for local traffic on Herbison Road is limited to **only** people directly living on Herbison Road or people that have business at the Township Hall. We are requesting that people living in a subdivision off Herbison Road access their homes via an alternate route. All businesses at the east end of Herbison Road and BR-127 remain open, and you can access them from Herbison Road.

During this period when Herbison Road is closed, only one lane of Herbison Road is accessible for local traffic from Rambler Road to just east of Addington Drive. Most of the time, this one lane will only be accessible from the east (BR-127). However, there may be times, based on construction needs, that Herbison Road will be accessible only from the west (DeWitt Road). Unfortunately, we do not know which access will be open on which days. Please follow the posted detour signs.

This project will have a large impact on a number of people, especially those living directly on Herbison Road. We appreciate your patience as we complete this necessary improvement.

The Township Hall will be open during this construction. You will also be able to access the Herbison Road Fire Station to vote on Election Day.

CAN YOU SEE YOUR ADDRESS FROM THE ROAD?

If you can't, then neither can emergency service agencies. The DeWitt Township Fire Department asks for your help in making sure your address is properly posted. When police, fire, or an ambulance service is summoned to your address, it is important that the address be clearly visible. The following is a summary of Section 5.01 of the Clinton County Address Ordinance. This information will help you in making sure your home or business is addressed properly. In an emergency, we want to do our best to find your home or business quickly.

- ✓ Your numbers must be Arabic numerals (0, 1, 2, 3,...), not script.
- ✓ Numbers must be visible from the road.
- ✓ Numbers must be at least three inches tall, but can be taller.
- ✓ Numbers must be visible from both sides of a mailbox. If two boxes are side by side, numbers must be posted in another location.
- ✓ Numbers must contrast with background color of the structure supporting the numbers.
- ✓ Numbers must be posted two feet above the ground, and not more than six feet above grade.
- ✓ Be sure your number is not blocked by trees or shrubs.
- ✓ If your house is more than 100 feet from the road, your number must be posted on a post, fence, tree or other visible location.

With your help, emergency services can better assist you in your time of need.

BUILDING CONTRACTOR LICENSING REQUIREMENTS & VERIFICATION

These are hard times for many on both sides of the fence in the construction industry. The Building Department is seeing that construction activity has increased in the areas of remodeling and additions to existing homes.

This trend warrants a caution. **Be careful! Make sure that these, “too good to be true” prices are not because the individual you are dealing with is not licensed!**

Any person working on a project that involves one or more contracts, the aggregate contract price for which labor, material, profit and any other item is \$600 or more, is required to be licensed by the State of Michigan to engage in that work. They cannot divide the work into separate contracts to evade the requirement.

If you have any doubts about whether the individuals you are dealing with are currently licensed, contact the Building Department at 668-0278. We can help you verify the status of a license. For those with access to the web, you may check a residential builder’s licenses by going to <http://www.cis.state.mi.us/verify.htm>. This site enables you to check the licenses of many different professions requiring state licensing, but you will want to select “Builder, Residential” from the list and you will be transferred to another site where you can search by name to see the status of an individual’s license.

Electrical, plumbing and mechanical licenses can only be checked by calling individual divisions of the State Department of Labor & Economic Growth. It is probably easier to let us check those for you. If you have any doubts, just give us a call. We’ll be happy to help you.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT



Tim Horton's is proud to support local initiatives that make a difference. Fire Chief Fred Koos and Police Chief Brian Russell agree with that concept. On May 10, 2008, the DeWitt Township Police and Fire departments spent time on the roof of the new Tim Horton's to raise money for the Red Cross. The departments collected over \$200 and are already planning for next year's event. The goal for 2009 is to have better media coverage and to raise 10 times the amount that was raised this year. The event is held in other locations across the state. Police and firefighters stay on the roof until a specific dollar amount is raised.

SOUTH CENTRAL AREA PLAN UPDATE

Progress continues on the South Central Area Plan. A draft of the first components of the Plan is underway. The consultant hired to assist in the completion of the Plan has summarized the issues and assets that exist in the South Central Area, as identified by the participants in the community visioning session.

The Plan is a study of the area roughly bounded by Sheridan Road at the southern border of the Township, and Stoll Road at the north end. The east and west boundaries of the area are Wood Road and DeWitt Road. The purpose of the study is to identify the "positives" and the "negatives" in the southern area of the Township. Our goal is to develop a plan to build on the positives and reduce the negatives so that new investment will grow, helping to protect and enhance the property values of the homes and businesses in this part of our community.

The Township plans to hold a "walk-in workshop" in mid-August at the Township Community Center. The purpose of the workshop will be to allow interested citizens and business owners to review the recommendations to address the issues and build on the assets in the South Central Area. The consultant, as well as Township officials, will be present to answer questions and to hear your feedback. These comments will be used to revise the draft Plan before it is presented at a public hearing later this year.

INFORMATION IS THE KEY

Sometimes it's those little assumptions that confuse us. The things we don't really think about that may lead to misunderstandings or confusion. We hope this section will be useful to our residents, clearing up those misunderstandings, eliminating confusion or just providing useful information.

REVENUE SHARING AND YOU

It's possible that you have heard the term "revenue sharing" in the news, by our state representative or senator and even by township officials. Like many, it may come across as one of those "government" words that you don't completely understand and you wonder what all the fuss is about.

Did you know that revenue sharing helps pay for essential services that keep you safe? Or that revenue sharing helps us maintain the roads within the township? It does these things and much more. Revenue sharing has a direct impact on you as a resident of DeWitt Township.

What exactly is revenue sharing?

Revenue sharing is money that local governments, such as townships, cities, villages and counties, receive from the state. Revenue sharing was established in 1946 by a vote of the people through a constitutional amendment to replace and relieve local taxation. The state promised to give local governments a portion of the money it received from other state taxes, including the sales and income taxes, and the Single Business Tax. The primary purpose of revenue sharing, when first implemented, was to limit local taxing authority while increasing state taxing authority, with the idea that a predetermined amount would be shared with the local government. Revenue sharing provides a basic level of funding for services to all cities, villages and townships, and to a few counties.

Revenue sharing was designed to be a flexible, non-restricted funding source that a community could use to best fit its needs. Local communities rely on revenue sharing to pay for services that directly impact your life. It is used to help fund police and fire protection as well as roads, water, sewer services and a variety of other essential local services.

There are two types of revenue sharing in Michigan: statutory revenue sharing and constitutional revenue sharing. In 1996, the state stopped distributing revenue sharing from the income tax, Single Business Tax and intangibles tax, instead dedicating a percentage of the first 4 percent of the sales tax to revenue sharing.

Due to the method used by the state Legislature to cut revenue sharing in order to balance the state budget, of the 1,242 townships across the state, less than 300 townships receive any amount of statutory revenue sharing. More than 945 townships receive only constitutional revenue sharing. For the state's 2008 fiscal year, DeWitt Township is expected to receive \$837,037 in constitutional revenue sharing and \$56,941 in statutory revenue sharing.

So how does this affect life here in our township?

Revenue sharing funding, although promised by the state, is also at the mercy of the state's economy and how much revenue the state takes in each year. In recent years, funding for revenue sharing has seen dramatic cuts as the state's economy has lagged. And as we look to

future years, with skyrocketing gas prices and people cutting back on extras, revenue from sales tax could decrease, further impacting our revenue sharing funding and local services.

As lawmakers in Lansing battle over the 2008-09 fiscal year budget, which begins on Oct. 1, 2008, revenue sharing is once again a high profile topic. Now more than ever, money that local communities rely on to pay for essential services that directly impact your lives is continually being threatened. It is important that the township, on behalf of their residents, receives the appropriate level of funding to assist with local services.

Here at DeWitt Township, we are doing all we can to make sure our state representative and senator are aware of how revenue sharing impacts our community. Just like you are counting on us to make this community a wonderful place to live, we are counting on Lansing lawmakers to make sure we receive proper funding from the state.

CLINTON COUNTY HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Clinton County Housing Improvement Program offers assistance to income-eligible homeowners to make needed repairs to their homes. Eligible repairs may include roofing, windows, siding, carpeting, insulation, wells or septic systems, or any general improvement that makes the home safer, more livable and energy efficient. The program is administered in accordance with the following guidelines:

- The applicant must be the owner-occupant of a single family home in Clinton County.
- Applications will be addressed on a first-come, first-served basis.
- The property must be economically feasible to rehabilitate.
- Manufactured housing is eligible only if permanently affixed to the property.
- The applicant must provide evidence of ownership by means of a recorded warranty deed, recorded land contract or life estate interest.
- The applicant must provide evidence of homeowner's insurance.
- Property taxes and debt against the property must be current.
- Program funds may be used only to cover the cost to meet HUD Housing Quality Standards, lead hazards, building permits and related fees.
- Addition of living space is eligible if in accordance with MSHDA policy and a dollar-for-dollar match provided.
- All work will be performed by State licensed contractors.
- Project financing and lien requirements shall be in accordance with current MSHDA policies.
- All applicable projects and improvements shall comply with Federal Regulation 24 CFR Part 35 for lead based paint hazards.
- All work is subject to applicable local building codes and HUD Housing Quality Standards.
- The applicant's gross annual income shall be under the 80% of the area median income as determined by HUD and illustrated below:

- Eligible improvements are those which make the home more energy efficient, safe and accessible and may include: defective plumbing, heating and electrical systems; roofing, windows and doors; wall repair and floor coverings; siding and exterior repairs; ramps and bathroom accessibility.

The Homeowner Assistance Program is accepting applications for income-eligible homeowners to make needed repairs and improvements. Program funding is subject to availability from the Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA). Absentee Ballots: If you qualify to receive an absentee ballot (i.e. you plan to be absent from the community, or are 60 years of age or older), please contact the Clerk's Office to make arrangements to receive an absentee ballot. **The Absentee Ballot Application you will be receiving is a dual application, which allows you to apply for both the August Primary and November General Election ballots. Please be sure to check off the appropriate boxes on the application for the election(s) for which you wish to receive a ballot.** The Clerk's Office is always open from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on the Saturday before any election, to allow for absentee voting.

Sample ballots will be available in the Clerk's office approximately 30 days prior to each election. If there are any propositions on the ballot, it is often useful to read the propositions before Election Day.

Your **voter identification card** shows whether you vote at Herbison Woods School, the Township Herbison Road Fire Station, or the Township Community Center. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

NOTICE TO VOTERS: PHOTO ID REQUIREMENT

Election law now requires every voter to show picture identification when applying to vote on Election Day. **Election workers will ask to see a photo ID** as part of the usual ballot application process at the polls. The ID must include the person's photo and name. It does not have to include a residential address.

Voters with picture identification: Voters can satisfy the requirement by showing a Michigan driver's license or Michigan personal identification card. Voters who do not possess either document can show alternate forms of picture ID as long as the documents are current.

Voters without picture identification: Michigan election law anticipates that not all voters will have picture identification. Voters who do not bring picture identification to the polls or do not possess picture identification can vote like any other voter by signing an affidavit. DEWITT PUBLIC LIBRARY PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETINGS

The DeWitt Public Library is holding a series of public informational meetings on the upcoming August 5th ballot proposal. The proposal, if approved, would increase library millage by .95 mill for 20 years to build and fund a new district library building. The proposal would also renew the current .5 mill when it expires in 2010. All millage would expire in 20 years at which time the bonds on the new building would have been paid off.

The DeWitt Public Library includes all of the city of DeWitt, DeWitt Township and the portions of Watertown Township in the DeWitt, St. Johns and Lansing school districts.

Informational meetings are scheduled for Wednesday, July 9th, 7 p.m., DeWitt City Fire Station, 911 W. Main Street and Tuesday, July 23rd, 7 p.m., DeWitt Township Community Center, 16101 Brook Road. 2008 ROAD CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

The following is a summary of some of the major projects within the Township. As normal with construction projects, any of the dates specified may change due to weather or other construction related issues. Many of these projects may have started and/or finished by the time you receive this update.

State Road - Both sewer and road work will occur on the section of State Road between BR127 and DeWitt Road. The sewer work was completed in early June. The Clinton County Road Commission will begin resurfacing this section of State Road. This work will also include paving 1,375 feet of the shoulder east of Turner Road.

Stoll Road - Two minor repairs will be made on the sewer near the intersection of DeWitt and Stoll Roads.

Ralph Street - Just over a tenth of a mile of Ralph Street, from BR127 to Brook Road, will be resurfaced.

Boichot Road- East of BR127 will be resurfaced for one-half mile.

Northway Drive & Escanaba Drive- .39 miles of Northway Drive & Escanaba Drive just west of BR127 will be resurfaced. Additionally, sections of curb and gutter will be replaced in this area.

DeWitt Road – The Capital City Airport has plans to curve DeWitt Road just north of Sheridan Road. This curve to the east will make way for a future runway expansion.

Cutler Road –The Road Commission and Olive Township have plans to resurface Cutler Road between BR127 and Norris Road.

Chandler Road – The Road Commission will be resurfacing Chandler Road between Coleman and Hunsaker Drive in July or August.

CONDITIONAL RESCISSION OF PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE EXEMPTION

Governor Granholm recently signed House Bill 4215, enacting Public Act 96 of 2008. This amendment to the General Property Tax Act enables a person who has purchased a new home and established a new Principal Residence to retain a Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) on their former homestead property, as well, if certain criteria are met. An owner may continue to receive the homestead exemption for up to three years if the property is not occupied, is not rented or leased, is for sale, and is not used for any business or commercial purpose. The opportunity to apply and qualify for a conditional rescission begins for the 2008 tax year and is not retroactive to previous tax years.

An owner may receive the PRE on the previous principal residence (Homestead) for up to three years if the property continues to not be occupied, is for sale, is not leased, and is not used for any commercial purpose. The owner must annually submit Form 4640 on or before December 31 to verify to the assessor that the property for which the PRE is retained still meets eligibility.

For example, if an owner moves sometime during 2008 and files a new homestead affidavit on the new residence, he or she would have to submit the Conditional Rescission of Principal Residence Exemption affidavit each year by December 31 to receive the exemption for 2009, 2010, 2011.

It should be noted that conditional rescissions do not apply to homes in foreclosure where the bank has taken possession but where the home is vacant and for sale. Only the owner who previously occupied the property as his or her principal residence qualifies for the conditional rescission. Companies, such as banks, do not qualify for a PRE.

If a property owner has moved to another location but still owns the previous residence and rents or leases it for only a few months, the opportunity to receive the conditional rescission is no longer available.

An owner who still owns property in Michigan but has moved out of state does not qualify; nor does the owner who still owns his property, but has moved into an apartment. The owner of the property must be eligible for and claim an exemption for his or her current principal residence. A person renting an apartment is not eligible for an exemption on the former homesteaded property.

Conditional Rescission of Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) forms can be found on the Township's website at www.dewitttownship.org or by calling the Assessing Department at 669-6494.

SUMMER TAX BILL AND SUMMER DEFERMENT INFORMATION

The summer tax bills have been processed and mailed out. If you did not receive one, and know you should, please contact the Treasurer's Office at 668-1411. If your taxes are in an escrow account, the tax bill was mailed to the requesting financial institution. The due date for payment without additional interest is September 15, 2008.

For qualified residents, you may defer your summer tax bill until February 16, 2009 without interest or penalty fees. You can defer the summer taxes on only your principal residence. To qualify, you must meet the following guidelines: household income less than \$40,000 for the prior calendar year, **and** one of the following: senior citizen (62 years or older); paraplegic, quadriplegic; eligible serviceman, veteran, widow-widower; blind person; or totally and permanently disabled.

Those that farm agricultural real property may also qualify. For an application, please call the Treasurer's Office. **Residents who defer summer taxes must complete the application and submit it to the Treasurer's Office before September 15, 2008.**

The Treasurer will review the submitted tax deferment forms. As the property owner, you will be responsible for determining that you qualify for the deferment. If the deferment form contains any misleading or false statements, as the property owner, you may be subject to penalties and late payments on the taxes deferred.
